

Living, Dining, Events & Culture



Memphis offers an affordable cost of living compared to other major cities, with housing prices and rents well below the national average. Neighborhoods range from historic Midtown with its eclectic charm to the bustling downtown riverfront with modern apartments and condos. Residents enjoy a strong sense of community, access to top healthcare facilities and a vibrant mix of cultural and recreational amenities.

Memphis's dining scene combines Southern comfort with bold flavors. At McEwen's, favorites include buttermilk fried oysters, sweet potato crusted catfish and Chilean sea bass. Gus's World-Famous Fried Chicken is a local staple, known for its spicy, crispy fried chicken and homemade pies. For a casual breakfast, Sunrise Memphis serves hearty omelets, tacos and cinnamon rolls that keep crowds coming back.





Memphis celebrates its heritage and community with a packed calendar of events. Highlights include the Beale Street Music Festival, the Memphis in May International Festival and the Cooper-Young Festival. Cultural landmarks like the National Civil Rights Museum, Stax Museum of American Soul Music and Sun Studio showcase the city's lasting impact on history and music.



Outdoor Activities, Sports & Entertainment



Memphis offers plenty of ways to enjoy the outdoors. The riverfront features scenic trails, public art and sunset views along the Mississippi. Shelby Farms Park spans more than 4,500 acres, with lakes for kayaking, miles of trails, a zipline and open green spaces. Closer to the city center, Overton Park combines wooded trails, open fields and the popular Memphis Zoo.

Memphis is home to the NBA's Memphis Grizzlies and the Memphis Redbirds, the Triple-A affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals. College sports also energize the city, with the University of Memphis Tigers drawing big crowds for basketball and football. Venues like FedExForum and AutoZone Park make live sports a year-round experience.





The city's entertainment scene thrives on its musical legacy. Beale Street remains iconic for blues, jazz and live performances. The Memphis Symphony Orchestra and Ballet Memphis offer world-class classical and contemporary arts. Museums like the Brooks Museum of Art and the National Civil Rights Museum highlight both cultural and historical experiences.







Memphis is a center for logistics, healthcare and manufacturing. FedEx, headquartered in the city, is one of its largest employers, along with St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, International Paper and Baptist Memorial Health Care. With strong industries in transportation and healthcare, Memphis supports both established businesses and growing startups.

Memphis's location makes weekend trips easy. Head east to the Great Smoky Mountains for hiking and mountain views. Drive north to Nashville for live music, dining and cultural attractions, or travel south to New Orleans for vibrant street life, historic neighborhoods and world-famous cuisine.
