New York City blends urban energy with surprisingly abundant green spaces and outdoor escapes. Central Park offers 843 acres of trails and open fields right in the heart of Manhattan, perfect for walking, biking or running. Along the waterfront, the Hudson River Greenway provides miles of scenic paths with skyline views, while Prospect Park in Brooklyn offers a quieter, wooded retreat with meadows, trails and a lake.

New York City is a major hub for sports, home to legendary teams like the Yankees (MLB), Mets (MLB), Knicks (NBA), Nets (NBA) and Rangers (NHL), all playing within the five boroughs. Just outside the city, fans can also catch the Giants and Jets (NFL) in New Jersey or the Islanders (NHL) in nearby Elmont. From iconic venues like Madison Square Garden and Yankee Stadium to passionate fanbases, NYC offers a rich and diverse sports experience.
