Living in Los Angeles is 50% more expensive than the national average, but the diversity of neighborhoods, nearby towns and living situations offers residents a variety of options. Southern California has a desirable Mediterranean climate, with mild year-round temperatures and little rain. Outside of its highly urban areas, the landscape is dotted with valley's, mountains and a long coastline.

Los Angeles' dining scene blends global influences with laid-back California flair. At Bestia, an Italian favorite in the Arts District, diners can savor house-made pastas, woodfired meats and inventive desserts. Anju House, a popular spot in Koreatown, serves sharable dishes like kimchi fried rice, spam musubi and bulgogi sliders in a vibrant setting. Over in Hancock Park, Republique offers a casual daytime bakery and café alongside a more formal dining room, offering dishes like brioche French toast, braised short ribs and Tartine.





Experience Los Angeles' culture through guided tours of iconic neighborhoods like Hollywood, Koreatown and the historic Olvera Street. Dive into the city's rich diversity through local events such as the Lotus Festival in Echo Park, the Mexican Independence Day Parade and the Los Angeles Lantern Festival. Visit cultural landmarks like the Getty Center, the California African American Museum and the Japanese American National Museum to gain a deeper understanding of the city's many communities and histories.



#### **Outdoor Activities, Sports & Entertainment**



Los Angeles offers countless ways to enjoy the outdoors, whether you're exploring the city or escaping into nature. The beachfront path from Santa Monica to Venice is perfect for walking, biking, or soaking in ocean views. Griffith Park, one of the largest urban parks in the country, features miles of hiking trails, scenic overlooks and the iconic Griffith Observatory. For a more relaxed outing, head to Echo Park for paddle boating or enjoy a picnic among the gardens at Exposition Park. Just outside the city, the Santa Monica Mountains offer trails, waterfalls and sweeping coastal views.

Los Angeles is one of the most dynamic sports cities in the United States, home to teams such as the Lakers (NBA), Clippers (NBA), Dodgers (MLB), Angels (MLB), Rams (NFL), Chargers (NFL) and Kings (NHL). Soccer also has a strong presence, with LAFC and the Galaxy attracting dedicated supporters. Fans can catch games at iconic venues like Dodger Stadium, Crypto.com Arena and SoFi Stadium, showcasing the city's deep-rooted sports culture and passionate fan base.





As the epicenter of the entertainment industry, Los Angeles offers an unrivaled mix of film, television, music and arts. Hollywood remains a global symbol of filmmaking, with studios, soundstages and red-carpet premieres shaping the city's identity. The Hollywood Bowl and Walt Disney Concert Hall host world-class music performances, while institutions like the Getty Center and Los Angeles County Museum of Art showcase renowned collections. From small independent theaters to blockbuster movie sets, LA defines creativity on a global stage.
