Minneapolis has a humid continental climate, which means warm, wet summers and cold, snowy winters. The city gets about 30 inches of rain and 55 inches of snow each year, with temperatures ranging from 9°F to 83°F. The cost of living is generally 5% to 15.1% higher than the national average, largely because of housing. According to the Economic Policy Institute, a household income of around \$99,505 is what it takes to live comfortably in the Minneapolis–St. Paul area.

Minneapolis offers a dynamic food scene that celebrates both global traditions and local creativity. Spoon and Stable serves refined New American dishes like spaghetti nero and bison tartare in a chic environment. For rustic Italian, Red Rabbit pairs craft cocktails with pizzas, pastas and other small plates. Gai Noi brings bold Laotian flavors to the table, with standout plates like basil wings and panang spaghetti in a vibrant, casual setting.

Minneapolis makes the most of its natural surroundings with a mix of city trails, lakes and green space. The Chain of Lakes offers miles of paths for walking, biking or kayaking. Just outside downtown, the Minneapolis Sculpture Garden blends art and nature with iconic installations like the Spoonbridge and Cherry. For a more active outing, Minnehaha Park features waterfalls, picnic areas and trails that connect to the Mississippi River.

Minneapolis boasts a strong sports tradition, with major league teams like the Minnesota Twins (MLB), Minnesota Vikings (NFL), Minnesota Timberwolves (NBA) and Minnesota Wild (NHL) calling the city home. College sports add to the excitement, as the University of Minnesota Golden Gophers compete at the highest level in the Big Ten Conference. From historic stadiums to game-day festivities, Minneapolis offers a full spectrum of sports experiences for locals and visitors alike.

The Guthrie Theater hosts acclaimed plays on the riverfront, while the Orpheum Theatre draws Broadway tours and top music acts. And First Avenue, made famous by Prince, remains a legendary spot for live music of all genres.

Several major employers are based in Minneapolis, including Target Corp., U.S. Bancorp, Xcel Energy, Ameriprise Financial and Allina Health. The city also plays a key role in the healthcare, finance and retail sectors, with several Fortune 500 companies maintaining headquarters or significant operations in the area. The broader Twin Cities region supports a diverse economy, anchored by innovation in medical technology, manufacturing and education.

For a quick getaway, several scenic spots are just a short drive from Minneapolis. Head north to Duluth for Lake Superior views and waterfront trails. Venture to Itasca State Park to walk across the headwaters of the Mississippi and explore old-growth pines. Or spend a relaxing weekend in Lanesboro, a picturesque small town known for biking the Root River Trail, trout fishing and tubing.
