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
## Outdoor Activities, Sports & Entertainment

San Diego is home to several well-supported sports teams, including the San Diego Padres (MLB) and San Diego FC (MLS). Collegiate sports are also popular, with San Diego State University competing at the Division I level and drawing strong local support. The city also hosts major sporting events throughout the year, adding to an active sports culture.

With sunshine year-round, outdoor activity is woven into daily life in San Diego. Balboa Park spans more than 1,200 acres and features gardens, trails and cultural landmarks. The park offers ample space for walking, cycling and relaxation. Along the coast, beaches such as La Jolla Shores, Pacific Beach and Coronado invite surfing, swimming and paddleboarding. Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve provides hiking trails with sweeping views of the Pacific.



San Diego's economy is supported by employers across biotechnology, healthcare, defense and technology. Major organizations include Qualcomm, Illumina, UC San Diego, Scripps Health and General Dynamics. These companies contribute to a strong employment base and continued growth across the region.

Several popular destinations are within easy reach of San Diego. Anza-Borrego Desert State Park and Joshua Tree National Park offer outdoor escapes within driving distance, while Temecula Valley provides access to wineries and weekend retreats.
